New Green is the first development to be completed as part of Wates and Havering Council's '12 Estates' programme to regenerate 12 estates across Havering Council, which will be bringing 3,500 much needed new homes. The former Napier and New Plymouth site in Rainham provides 197 new homes including 126 modern affordable homes and a further 71 homes available to buy under a shared ownership scheme, prioritising Havering's key workers and local people to get onto the housing ladder. This Project Impact Report showcases the meaningful social impact that Wates and our partners have brought to Havering and the surrounding communities as part of our presence.



We believe that everyone deserves a great place to live. This means looking beyond bricks and mortar to deliver a special type of regeneration, focused on listening to the needs of local people.
