


#### **WHO WE ARE**

#### **APPRENTICESHIPS**

If you have a son or daughter currently studying towards GCSEs or A-Levels the questions below have more than likely come up in conversation. With the government pushing for 3 million apprenticeships by 2020, the key thing to remember is that apprenticeships today are not how you remember them. They are now a real alternative to college or university and offer young people the chance to earn as they learn.



#### What is an apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is a full-time job which also includes training and professional development. It is a chance for your son or daughter to develop valuable skills and gain a recognised qualification at the same time.

# What subjects can you do an apprenticeship in?

There are over 1,500 apprenticeships available and they can be found in various subjects ranging from Construction and Engineering to IT and Accountancy.

### How much does an apprenticeship get paid?

As the salary of an apprentice is paid by the employer, what they earn is at the employer's discretion, although all apprentices will earn the minimum wage for an apprentice, or above. The minimum wage for an apprentice has recently increased to £3.90/hour.


#### Who can do an apprenticeship?

Anyone above the age of 16 and not in full-time education can enrol on to an apprenticeship programme.

In England, since May 2015, over **1.7 million people** have started an apprenticeship

#### How long is an apprenticeship?

An Apprenticeship can range from 1 – 6 years depending on the subject and the level of the qualification. It mostly depends on the framework being followed and academic qualifications as well as the existing experience the apprentices may have at the start of the programme.







#### What levels of apprenticeships are available?

An apprenticeship has an equivalent education level, for example:

Apprenticeship Type	Level	Equivalent Education Level
Intermediate	2	5x GCSE passes at grades A* to C or 9-4
Advanced	3	2 x A-Level passes
Higher	4-7	Foundation degree and above
Degree	6 and 7	Bachelor's or Master's degree

It is important to note that there are entry requirements for each level and these differ depending on the sector, employer and job role.

## What happens after the apprenticeship programme has ended?

Often, apprentices are offered permanent employment on completion of their apprenticeship programme or supported to undertake a higher level apprenticeship in order to gain more qualification, however this can never be guaranteed. This is one of the main reasons why it is important to find the right organisation to support your apprenticeship.

#### How does it work?

Apprentices are employed by an organisation and work alongside existing employees. The majority of training takes place on the job. The apprentice will also be studying towards their qualification at a local college/university, training centre or a work-based learning provider.

One of the main benefits of doing an apprenticeship programme is, unlike university, there is no cost to the individual for the qualification. Depending on the size of the business the training costs are either covered fully by the employer or part funded by the employer and the government.

It is also mandated by the government that all apprentices receive 20% off the job learning throughout their apprenticeship programme. This is time given to the apprentices during working hours to focus on their qualification - this may equate to one day out of the week at college/university or a day out of the week to focus on coursework or revision.

#### **COMMON MISCONCEPTIONS ABOUT APPRENTICESHIPS**

Completing an apprenticeship will not lead to quality full-time employment.

Actually, by working for a company as part of the course, apprentices can make a positive impression on employers, which often results in a full-time role. Around 90% of apprentices are offered full-time employment after completing their programme.

Apprenticeships are only available to the manual industries.

This may have been the case when apprenticeships first started out, but now there are hundreds of different apprenticeships available in a range of different industries.

Apprenticeships are only for people who didn't do well in school.

Apprenticeships are a real alternative to university, and there are a number of professional apprenticeships available. Employers recognise that university isn't for everyone and many offer apprenticeship programmes to fast track apprentices into senior or management roles.

Apprenticeships are restricted to a certain age group.

Apprenticeships are open to anyone aged 16 or over. They are available to learners from all ages and not just school leavers. Apprenticeships are an opportunity for people to upskill, re-enter the workforce or even change their career path.

Graduates cannot complete an apprenticeship programme.

University graduates can also apply for apprenticeships as long as the qualification they choose differs from what they study at university.

Apprenticeships are considered lower value than university qualifications.

Apprentices can finish with the same qualification as a university graduate, and also have the advantage of having industry experience. They can become more valuable to a future employer than a graduate that has the qualification but no industry experience. There is also the added bonus of having no university debt to pay back at the end.

Apprentices always get paid next to nothing.

The National Minimum Wage for an apprentice is £4.15 for those aged under 19 or aged 19 and over and in their first year of their apprenticeship. More often than not employers will pay more so it is worth considering the salary before submitting an application.

#### SHARED APPRENTICESHIP SCHEMES

At Wates we also offer opportunities through a shared apprenticeship scheme. A shared apprenticeship scheme helps employers who want to support the development of skills while working on regional contracts, but are not in a position to offer a full term apprenticeship directly.

We work in partnership with apprenticeship training agencies such as Evolve and Future Works who will directly employ the apprentice and place them onto one of our sites for an agreed period of time.

#### **APPRENTICESHIPS DELIVERED THROUGH OUR SUBCONTRACTORS**

As a principal contractor we encourage our subcontractors to also recruit and develop apprentices. These are organisations who specialise in their trade, i.e. carpentry, plumbing or bricklaying.
